Engage: Future Choices Four Corners



This [four corners](#) activity teaches your students about choices and opportunity cost. Get your students moving and thinking about what they give up when they make a decision. This is a great way to introduce them to the economics of everyday life and get them thinking about the education and lifestyle choices they want after high school.

Teach: Back to school – Evaluating Postsecondary Opportunities

Students will use a variety of online tools as they compare the costs of postsecondary education at three different colleges or universities in their home state.

Assess: How do I get into college?



Using [Unit 3: How do I get in?](#) from the *Navigate* curriculum, students will complete a graphic organizer during an interactive presentation about the factors that colleges consider during the admission process. Instructors can extend the lesson by assigning students an admission essay.
